Introduction

This guide is a collection of walking locations in the Vale of Glamorgan where families, children, individuals with mobility concerns and others can access some fantastic countryside, coast and parkland. These locations may also suit people returning to exercise for whatever reason and those looking to explore the Vale.

The locations have been selected for their relative ease of access to walking opportunities. You can walk from 10 to 60 minutes or more, from parkland right through to wild remote places.

The guide is intended to be indicative only. It does not contain detailed or specific walking route descriptions or graded walks.



WALKING LOCATION

The old Cardiff Docklands were redeveloped at the end of the last century to create Cardiff Bay with a 220 hectare large freshwater lake for sailing and water sports. In 1999 new life was given to the area with the construction of the Cardiff Bay Barrage that transformed an area of tidal mudflats and sparked the development of the surrounding area.

Penarth Marina is situated within the sheltered waters of Cardiff Bay and built around the basins of the historic Penarth Docks.

The Paths: Barrage road (tarmac) & pavements

Marina — Quayside pavements and paved areas. Care required

SUGGESTED ROUTE

Visitors to Penarth can walk across the barrage to the inner Harbour Cardiff and Mermaid Quay.

This route provides safe pedestrian and cycle access.

The Pont-y-Werin footbridge provides a long circular route and additional options with transport links through to Cardiff City centre.

Parking: Some free parking other Pay & Display.



WALKING LOCATION

Penarth is a genteel seaside town set upon the Bristol Channel with a grand Victorian/ Edwardian charm with a range of fine buildings and parks.

The Paths: Tarmac Path. Pavements

SUGGESTED ROUTE

From the Cliff Top Car Park turn left along the coast to drop down onto the path to enjoy this Victorian seaside gem with a walk along the promenade and on to the beautifully restored pier. A return option is to take the road opposite the pier and turn left into Windsor Gardens which will return you to the car park on a higher level (inclines on both return routes)



WALKING LOCATION

Penarth headland is a wide grassy parkland area popular with families with far-ranging views over the Channel

The Paths: Tarmac Path. Footpath on to Lavernock

SUGGESTED ROUTE

From the Cliff Top Car Park turn right along the Cliff Walk with a grassy area to the right and Bristol Channel on your left, at the end of the path at the last of the houses you can return to the start

Alternatively you can extend your walk along the coastal footpath to Lavernock and retrace your steps.

WALKING LOCATION

Cosmeston, covering 100ha of countryside and lakes, offers a wonderful range of accessible walking opportunities.

A significant area of the park is designated as an SSSI (Site of Special Scientific Interest) protecting rare and diverse plant and animal species.

A variety of routes with varying distances are possible with route guides available from the park.

The Paths: Tracks - various surfaces, wide, well drained, generally well surfaced, loose chippings in places. Gravelled footpaths. Boardwalks

FACILITIES

Visitor Centre: Open 10am - 6pm April to

Sept. 10am - 5pm Oct. to Mar.

Parking: Large car and coach park.

Entry Charges: No but parking charges apply

Refreshments: Café, Open 9am - 5.30pm

Toilets: Yes

Disabled: Parking spaces and toilets available. Ramp access to visitor centre and café.

Other: Nature trails, dog friendly trails, picnic tables, barbecues.

WALKING LOCATION

A classic, traditional seaside location with a glorious sandy beach. Beach, promenade and costal path. Enjoy a 'walk along the prom' or along Blue Flag Whitmore Bay beach.

The Paths: Promenade. Pavements. Tarmac Footpaths. Grass Tracks

FACILITIES

Parking: Yes on street and paid

Entry Charges: No

Refreshments: Various Toilets: Yes

Other: Tourist Information Centre, Amuse-

ments, Fun Fair, Audio Walk.

SUGGESTED ROUTE 1

Walk left from the beach along tracks to reach Nell's Point past the coastguard lookout, enjoying panoramic views of the islands in the Bristol Channel. Further round are views down to Jackson's Bay, the harbour and sailing club.

SUGGESTED ROUTE 2

Walk right from the beach to reach Friars
Point with more stunning views over Barry
Harbour and out to sea.

The Waterfront development sits aside the old industrial port of Barry, the foremost coal port of the last century. Opportunities to stroll along the harbourside with the option of a walk across to Barry Island via a stairway and road. The historic Dock Offices sit proudly overlooking the harbour.

220 acres of woods and meadowland in a sheltered valley leading to a pebble beach and views of spectacular cliffs. Porthkerry Country Park offers a variety of walking opportunities on a range of surfaces to suit all. There are waymarked trails and route leaflets available from the park

The Paths: Woodland trail - dry compacted surface, one flight of steps near café. Parkland - level cut grass surface. Concrete footpaths - directly from café/car park to coast.

Refreshments: Café open 9.30am from April







WALKING LOCATION

Forestry with primarily conifer woodland with pockets of native broadland species located in a peaceful rural location in the centre of the Vale. Hensol forest offers a range of walking opportunities on forest tracks and footpaths. The more accessible walking is along forest tracks and not specifically waymarked

The Paths: Forest tracks - firm, wide, well drained tracks with some loose chippings.

SUGGESTED ROUTE

Exit car park on to a forest track. Turn right and proceed until you reach a junction with a track on your left. Turn left here and proceed until you reach a cross roads of tracks. Turn left here and follow track until you return to car park.



WALKING LOCATION

Forestry with primarily conifer woodland with pockets of native broadland species leading to a beautiful lake in a wild setting. Hensol forest offers a range of walking opportunities on forest tracks and footpaths. The more accessible walking is along forest tracks and not specifically waymarked

The Paths: Forest tracks - firm, wide, gently sloping, well drained tracks with some loose chippings.

SUGGESTED ROUTE

There are several linear walks from this start point, which take in the lake and surrounding forestry. Due to changes to improve access being made by National Resources Wales (NRW) it is suggested you explore the various pathways and find routes that meet your particular needs.



A large grassy area on the cliffs adjacent to the car park has some of the most stunning views on the Coast.

The Paths: Tarmac Path.

Walk along the track to the imposing lighthouse and a public footpath takes you into the walled Trinity House grounds



WALKING LOCATION

Beatiful sandy beach at low tide set within rugged clif top location on the Glamorgan Heritage Coast

The Paths: Tarmac Track

SUGGESTED ROUTE

Head through the lodge gates along the tarmac track up an incline to Dunraven Gardens and beyond to dramatic cliff top views.

Alternatively a track will take you from the lower car park a short way up the valley to the Glamorgan Coast Heritage Centre.
