Mike Edwards, Walk Leader reports "We meet every other Wednesday at 10.30 am at the Bron-Y-Mar car Park, Cold Knap for an hour's walk. There are no steps or stiles, and within 5 minutes of walking we have excellent veiws of the Bristol Channel and the pleasant beaches of Watch Tower Bay and the Pebble Beach, plus the Parade Gardens.

The importance of Strollers walks is the social element. Once we get going our members are chatting away to each other and new members are always made to feel welcome". Mike is proud to be one of the three experienced Walk Leaders who take part in The Knap Strollers, one of Valeways first health walks, ending with a well-earned coffee or tea at Romilly's Café, where there is are always a warm welcome.

#### A new Strollers walk planned for Wenvoe

Kate Weston, a Valeways walk leader and a Wenvoe resident in the 1970s, is planning to launch an occasional series of 'strollers' walks in the village of Wenvoe in 2023.

The trial run (date tbc) will start and finish at the Wenvoe Community Hub at Wenvoe Library. It will follow a gentle route around the village, with no stiles or steep slopes and



will last around 45 minutes. The Community Hub will be open for refreshments at the end of the walk.

If sufficient interest is generated, future walks are planned into the surrounding area with the same emphasis on up-to-one-hour walks on firm ground, without steep slopes or steps and finishing at a coffee shop or similar for a cuppa and a chat.

#### Valways AGM

Many Friends, walkers, and supporters attended this year's AGM on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> November at the Community Enterprise Centre, Skomer Road, Barry. A summary of progress and activities over the year was provided by Chair of Trustees, Peter Weston's report:

**Introduction.** This AGM covers the period between October 2021 and October 2022, so we're back on our usual schedule, post-pandemic.

As I reported last year, Valeways continues to look to the future with confidence. We are lucky to have competent (volunteer) management in all areas, as well as sufficient numbers of willing volunteers.

All the key areas of Valeways' activities continue to prosper, several major projects have been completed and others are still in progress.

Here are the highlights:

**Led Walking.** Carolyn Gully has continued her expert management of a full programme, while Paul Hawkins has overseen an expansion in the number of Walk Leaders, with associated training. Our walk leaders offered the full range of walks following the pandemic restrictions, attracting larger numbers of walkers.

We have gained 3 new walk leaders Gwenda Fitzpatrick who has restarted the bilingual walks, Shelia Vaquerizo who has added another long walk option to our programme and Owen Leach who has stepped up from helping Mike run his strollers to run and organise his own 2 boot walks. Owen has also indicated he will take over the Cosmeston Strollers should Babs decide to stand down.

**Walk and Clear.** This core area of Valeways' activities has become increasingly popular and Peter Jones and his team continue the good work with the Tuesday working parties and close liaison with Vale of Glamorgan PROW.

**Walking Festival.** The concentrated efforts of a team including Rebecca Exley, Alan Simmonds and Paul Hawkins have delivered another successful Vale of Glamorgan Walking Festival in September 2022 and look forward to continuing using the early part of September in 2023.

# Projects.

The 'IT Renewal project' successfully launched two new websites last summer; the main Valeways website (<u>https://www.valeways.org.uk/</u>) and the Walking Festival website with improved design and content, with enhanced security. Work continues establishing the associated online Document Management System.

The Heritage Lottery project was completed and the final report submitted securing

the significant grant (£8,600).

Friends of Valeways was taken on by Lynne Frugtniet and Barbara Green who

organised a successful 'Walk and Piano Recital' event in April.

Two Strong Communities grant applications were submitted and claims made to help

fund the IT Renewal project and pay for waymarkers.

# **Other Activities**

Promotion- Valeways had stands at the Vale Show and the Romilly Park Dog Show to demonstrate our activities. As a result a number of new walkers were recruited. We are also working closely with Cowbridge Walkers are Welcome and Rebecca attended the national get together in Hampshire to promote our activities.

10 Days in May - a number of our walk leaders acted as back markers for the Vale Council's festival in May. The event was aimed to promote the county via social media and press articles.

Weatherman Walking - 20 Valeways volunteers headed to the Salmon Leaps ahead of Derek Brockway's arrival with the production crew, to be filmed clearing the footpath. Derek interviewed Rebecca about the work of Valeways and Dave talked about the walk route. The programme is to be aired in Spring 2023.

**Management.** The trustees continue to act as the management team and worked effectively to stabilise the charity's main activities and deliver on the key projects.

Following her co-option as Minute Secretary in 2021 and her acceptance as a trustee at last year's AGM, Angharad Hills will now be appointed Secretary for the charity, following the retirement of Peter Cornell.

David Phillips has announced his own retirement after many years' service as a trustee, but will hopefully continue to lead walks.

I'm also happy to announce that our recent appeal for new Trustees to come forward has met with a positive response. Three volunteers joined our October trustees' meeting and have the opportunity to be approved as trustees today in this meeting.

I'd like to thank <u>all</u> those who have contributed so much time and effort towards ensuring that Valeways has once again survived all the threats to its existence and has emerged as strong and healthy as ever.

Finally, I know I don't need to remind that we live in and share the delights of the Vale of Glamorgan and that Valeways continues, after 26 years, to be an essential part of all this.
